Abbreviations - Academic Abbreviations

Greek

παρ. (παράρτημα)

Used when there are relevant files added to the work

περ. (κατά προσέγγιση)

Used when quantity is unknown

Βιβλιο. (Βιβλιογραφία)

List of sources used

περ. (περίπου)

Used when estimating a quantity

κεφ. (κεφάλαιο)

A defined section of the work

στήλη

The vertical part of a table

διατριβή

A complete work on a specific subject

επιμ. (επιμέλεια)

Used when the work has been altered by a third party

π.χ. (παραδείγματος χάριν)

Used when giving an example

ειδ. (ειδικά)

Used when trying to define something more clearly

κτλ. (και τα λοιπά)

Used when stating an infinite list, literally meaning 'and so forth'

Σχ. (Σχήμα)

A diagram that accompanies part of the work

δηλαδή,...	c.-à-d. (c'est-à-dire)
Used when developing an idea, literally meaning 'therefore' or 'that is'	
συμπερ. (συμπεριλαμβανομένου)	incl. (inquant)
Used when adding something to a list	
σημ. (σημείωση)	N.B. (nota bene)
Used when a person is required to take note of something important	
σελ. (σελίδα)	p. (page)
Each individual side of paper in a manuscript	
σελ. (σελίδες)	pp. (pages)
Several sides of paper in a manuscript	
Προτ. (πρόλογος)	préf. (préface)
A short paragraph that provides a background to a study	
δημοσιεύθηκε από	éd. (édité par)
Used to name the person who has published the work	
αναθ. (αναθεωρήθηκε από)	rev. (revu par)
Used when the work has been altered slightly by someone to make it more relevant to the current audience	
ανατύπωση	réimp. (réimpression)
Used when the work is not an original, but a direct copy	
μεταφράστηκε από	trad. (traduit par)
Used when the work has been translated into another language	
τομ. (τόμος)	vol. (volume)
Indicates a specific volume or section of work
